

Download Template For Will In California

The California last will and testament is a legal document that's used for the purpose of distributing an individual's property, whether it's personal or real estate, upon their death to those they would like to receive it. The form should be formulated with at least two (2) witnesses present at the time of signing and it should be kept with a family attorney or more than one (1) individual in the family (or with friends) to ensure that the document is not tampered with in any way.

California is one of only four states that allow statutory wills, a preprinted will form where you can simply check boxes and sign beneath each paragraph. This makes it possible to write a will for free in the state, but it also limits the nature of your bequests. Your only options are those included in the form; if you cross anything out or add anything extra, your will is invalidated.

In California, these forms must also be signed by two different witnesses who can both attest that the Testator (the person distributing their assets) is of sound mind when the form was written. After the form is created and signed by all parties, it should be kept with an attorney or more than one family member so that the document is not tampered with in any way.

Codicil to Will PDF Sample The sample codicil to will below details changes to the last will and testament of 'Jarvis B Jones'. In this codicil, Jarvis B Jones states that he would like a passage of his will to be deleted in its entirety, and otherwise agrees to reaffirm and republish the other parts of the will.

However, California allows your will to be self-proved without a self-proving affidavit. As long as you sign and witness your will correctly, your will does not have to be proved to the probate court, and there's no need to make a self-proving affidavit.

A California last will and testament may be changed whenever the testator desires; indeed, the State Bar of California recommends you review your will "periodically" to address any circumstances or intentions that may have changed since you drafted it.
